

Adapt, Innovate, and Overcome

Dear Shepherds Friends,

Coming off a successful 2018-19 year, we started our 2019-20 academic and fiscal year with great momentum, optimism and enthusiasm. Then the pandemic

> hit, and we turned our energy towards new priorities. Our motto became "adapt.

> > innovate, and overcome."

Shepherds not only survived the health, financial and social crises of the past 18 months, we came out of it smarter, more dynamic, and most importantly, and perhaps surprisingly, more connected. Our mentors, students and alumni have all shown an admirable willingness to fulfill

their mentoring commitments and support one another throughout these past months. It has been a distinct honor to witness this strength in our Shepherds community. This year, some of our accomplishments include:

- 60 Shepherds students successfully completed their 2019-20 school year
- 10 Shepherds students graduated with college acceptances
- \$279,000 of tuition support provided to our partner schools
- 66% of Shepherds mentors contributed to tuition and programming expenses
- · Re-designed student and mentor recruiting, training, and interaction to accommodate a virtual environment.

In late spring 2020, we received an outpouring of inquiries from people who felt inspired to connect with Shepherds to make a difference in the lives of local disadvantaged youths.

They told us they wanted to "be part of the solution." With new resources, the incoming Class of 2024 was increased to 16 students, all with committed mentors and funded with mentor and sponsor support.



INCOME AND EXPENSES, JULY 1, 2019-JUNE 30, 2020






STUDENT PERSPECTIVES
